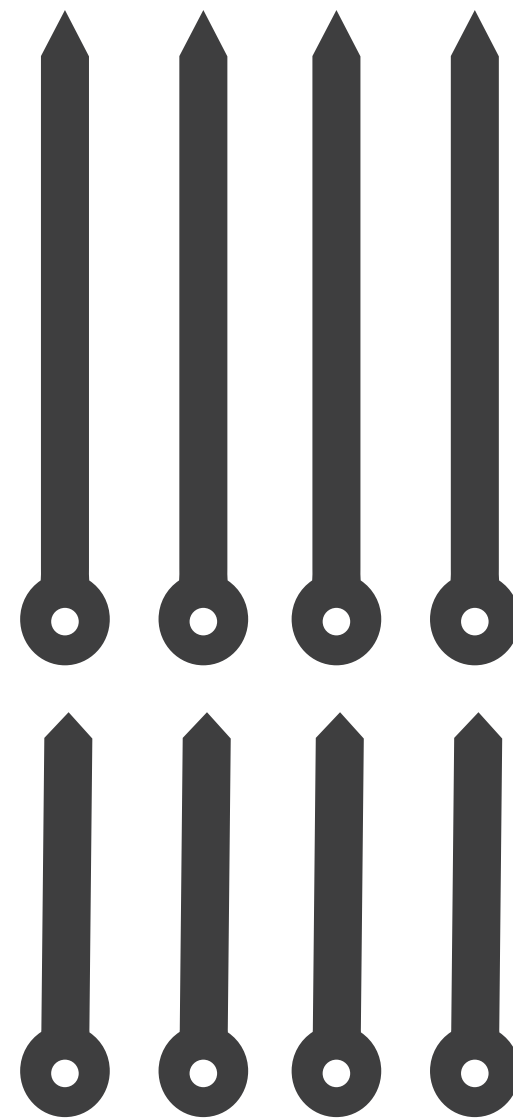


How to use this resource:

1. Colour in the clock face if you wish
2. Stick the whole page on to thin card
3. Cut along the dotted line
4. Cut out one set of hands (keep the others as spares)
5. Pin your clock onto a notice board
6. Pin the hands in the centre
7. Practice telling the time!

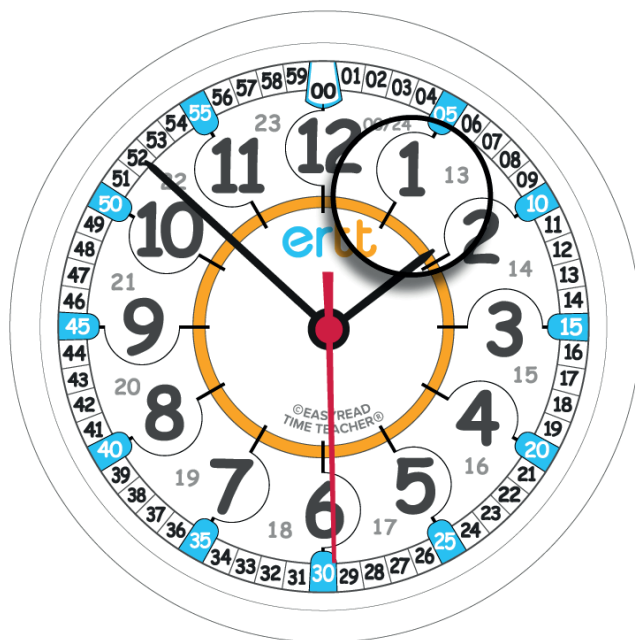


How to use this teaching resource

This clock is designed to help your child learn to read the clock and say the time like they're reading a digital clock.

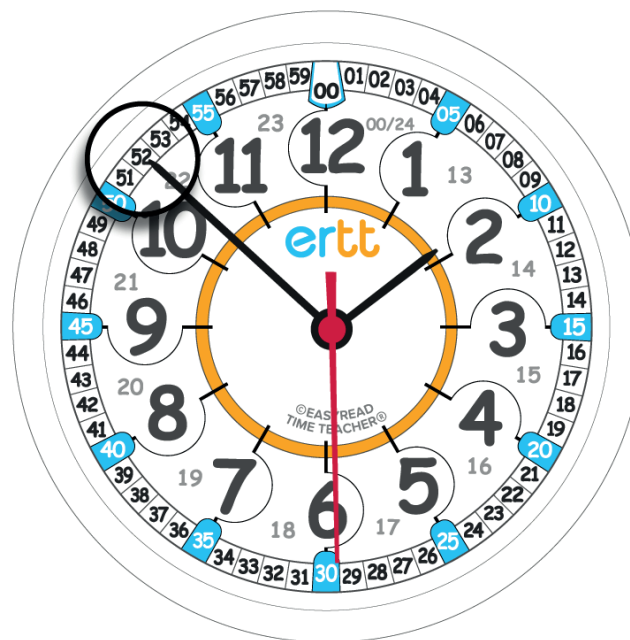
For example, to express the time as '12:15' or '1:45'.

Once you've made your clock, simply position the hands anywhere you like and teach your child 2 steps to read the clock.



Step One:

Read the number in the section at the end of the short hand... '1'



Step Two:

Read the number at the end of the long hand... '52'

Say it like this: '1:52'. Or, for 24 hour time, say '13:52' after midday.

Your child should focus on the points of the hands, and read the number in the minute box or hour section that the hands are pointing to.
