




This clock is designed to help your child learn to read the clock and say the time as 'minutes past' or 'minutes to' the hour. For example, to say the time as '10 past 3' or '20 to 4', 'quarter to 6' or 'half past 12'.


It's the style of telling the time used in conversation in many countries, although we don't often write the time like this.

Once you've made your clock, simply position the hands at various different times and teach your child 3 steps to read the clock.




EASYREAD TIME TEACHER

Step One: Read the number at the end of the long hand... '8'



Step Two: Say which side it's pointing to... 'minutes to'

Say it like this: '8... minutes to... 2'



Step Three: Read the number at the end of the short hand... '2'

Your child should focus on the points of the hands, and read the number in the minute box or hour box that the hands are pointing to.
