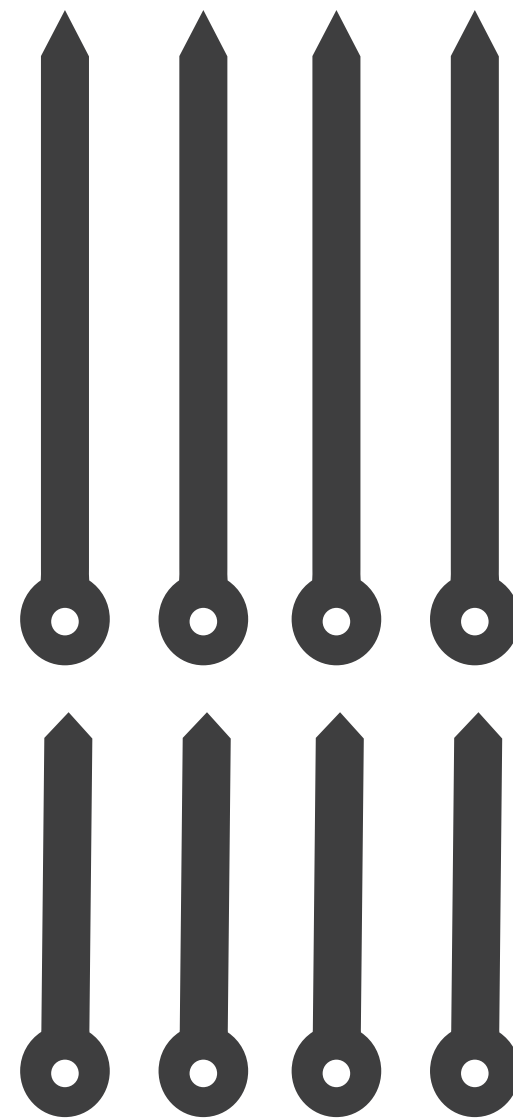


### How to use this resource:

1. Colour in the clock face if you wish
2. Stick the whole page on to thin card
3. Cut along the dotted line
4. Cut out one set of hands (keep the others as spares)
5. Pin your clock onto a notice board
6. Pin the hands in the centre
7. Practice telling the time!



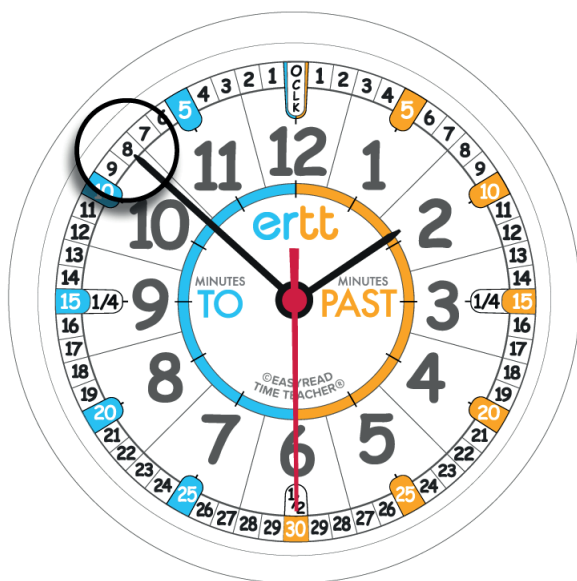
# How to use this teaching resource

This clock is designed to help your child learn to read the clock and say the time as 'minutes past' or 'minutes to' the hour.

For example, to say the time as '10 past 3' or '20 to 4', 'quarter to 6' or 'half past 12'.

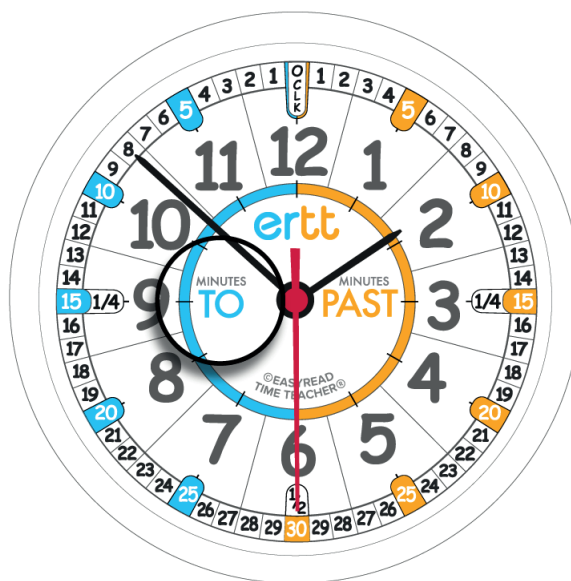
It's the style of telling the time used in conversation in many countries, although we don't often write the time like this.

Once you've made your clock, simply position the hands at various different times and teach your child 3 steps to read the clock.



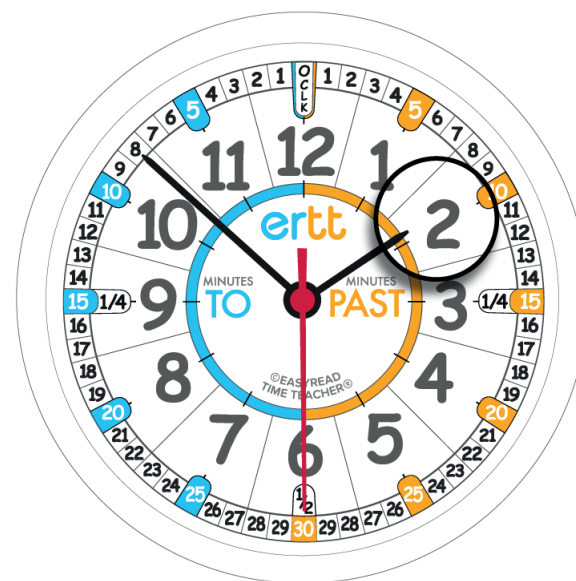
## Step One:

Read the number at the end of the long hand... '8'



## Step Two:

Say which side it's pointing to... 'minutes to'



## Step Three:

Read the number at the end of the short hand... '2'

Say it like this: '8... minutes to... 2'

Your child should focus on the points of the hands, and read the number in the minute box or hour box that the hands are pointing to.
